Lockdown Summary: What you can & cannot do

We all want to return to normal, we will only be able to do this when the virus is under control and community transmission rates are low. Below is a summary of the advice provided by the government, to read the full advice you can visit their website [here](#).

Coronavirus (COVID-19) is spreading fast. Do not leave your home unless necessary. 1 in 3 people who have the virus have no symptoms, so you could be spreading it without knowing it.

You must stay at home. The single most important action we can all take is to stay at home to protect the NHS and save lives. You should follow this guidance, this is the law.

Leaving home

You must not leave, or be outside of your home except where necessary. You may leave the home to:

- shop for basic necessities, for you or a vulnerable person
- go to work, or provide voluntary or charitable services, if you cannot reasonably do so from home
- exercise with your household (or support bubble) or one other person, this should be limited to once per day, and you should not travel outside your local area.
- meet your support bubble or childcare bubble where necessary, but only if you are legally permitted to form one
- seek medical assistance or avoid injury, illness or risk of harm (including domestic abuse)
- attend education or childcare - for those eligible
- If you do leave home for a permitted reason, you should always stay local - unless it is necessary to go further, for example to go to work. Stay local means stay in the village, town, or part of the city where you live.

If you are clinically extremely vulnerable you should only go out for medical appointments, exercise or if it is essential. You should not attend work.

By making sure that you abide by the rules set out by the government, you will help reduce the risk to your family and to the community as a whole. Let's do this together (but apart!).
